What information we collect and use, and why

Staff recruitment, administration and management

We collect or use the following personal information as part of **staff recruitment, administration and management**:

- Contact details (eg name, address, telephone number or personal email address)
- Date of birth
- National Insurance number
- Photographs (eg staff ID card)
- Copies of passports or other photo ID
- Copies of proof of address documents (eg bank statements or bills)
- Next of kin or emergency contact details
- Employment history (eg job application, employment references or secondary employment)
- Education history (eg qualifications)
- Right to work information
- Political, conflict of interest or gift declarations
- Performance records (eg reviews, disciplinary records, complaints or disciplinary action)
- Training history and development needs
- Monitoring employees' IT use



We also collect or use the following special category information for **staff recruitment, administration and management**. This information is subject to additional protection due to its sensitive nature:

- Biometric information

Salaries and pensions

We collect or use the following personal information as part of **managing salaries and pensions**:

- Job role and employment contract (eg start and leave dates, salary, changes to employment contract or working patterns)
- Time spent working (eg timesheets or clocking in and out)
- Expense, overtime or other payments claimed
- Leave (eg sick leave, holidays or special leave)
- Maternity, paternity, shared parental and adoption leave and pay
- Pension details
- Bank account details
- Payroll records
- Tax status

We also collect or use the following special category information for **managing salaries and pensions**. This information is subject to additional protection due to its sensitive nature:

- Biometric information (where used to identify someone)

Staff health and wellbeing

We collect or use the following personal information for **managing staff health and wellbeing**:

- General health and wellbeing information
- Sick leave forms or fit notes (eg Statement of Fitness for Work from a GP or hospital)
- Accident at work records
- Access needs or reasonable adjustments

Lawful bases and data protection rights Under UK data protection law, we must have a “lawful basis” for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO’s website.



Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are set out in brief below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO's website:

- **Your right of access** - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for. [Read more about the right of access.](#)
- **Your right to rectification** - You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete. [Read more about the right to rectification.](#)
- **Your right to erasure** - You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information. [Read more about the right to erasure.](#)
- **Your right to restriction of processing** - You have the right to ask us to limit how we can use your personal information. [Read more about the right to restriction of processing.](#)
- **Your right to object to processing** - You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data. [Read more about the right to object to processing.](#)
- **Your right to data portability** - You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you. [Read more about the right to data portability.](#)
- **Your right to withdraw consent** – When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. [Read more about the right to withdraw consent.](#)

If you make a request, we must respond to you without undue delay and in any event within one month.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data

Where we get personal information from

We collect your information from the following places:

- Directly from you
- Employment agency
- Schools, colleges, universities or other education organisations
- Referees (external or internal)
- Pension administrators or government departments (eg HMRC and DWP)
- Public sources (eg LinkedIn or other websites)

How long we keep information

We will keep some records permanently if we are legally required to do so. We may keep some other records for an extended period of time. For example, it is currently best practice to keep financial records for a minimum period of 8 years to support HM Revenue and Customs audit or provide tax information. We may have legal obligations to retain some data in connection with our statutory obligations as a public authority. The Council is permitted to retain data in order to defend or pursue claims. In some cases, the law imposes a time limit for such claims. We will retain some personal data for this purpose as long as we believe it is necessary to be able to defend or pursue a claim. In general, we will endeavour to keep data only for as long as we need it. This means that we will delete it when it is no longer needed.

Who we share information with

In some circumstances, we may share information with the following organisations:

- Training suppliers
- HMRC
- Suppliers and service providers

Data processors

We use the following data processors for the following reasons:

Suffolk Association of Local Councils (SALC)

This data processor does the following activities for us: They process our payroll and pension information.
